MILITARY MEDALS AND FLAG



Several years ago we framed a photo of Connie Fuller's Dad along with his military medals and awards. She and her Mother, Joyce Moore, wanted to have another shadow box made for Connie's brother. Because we had used most of his medals and awards in the prior frame, we suggested ordering replicas. We did have the flag that was presented to Joyce. The full-size commemorative flags, when folded, are about 3" deep, so we chose a gold-leaf shadowbox moulding with 4" of depth. The flag is hand-sewn into a recessed triangular opening surrounded by a matching gold fillet. The matting is hand-covered suede "Colonial Red". Conservation Clear Glass covers and protects this family treasure. Our good friends at Craters and Freighters built a custom wooden crate and shipped the box safety to Joyce in Georgia. Thanks Connie and Joyce, it was our pleasure to frame these treasures.

Ronald Reagan Letter

In 1964 Bob Schlitt, who was living in California, wrote a letter to Ronald Reagan encouraging him to run for public office. Bob received a personal reply typed and signed by the future President. After Reagan's death, Bob and Donna, his wife, decided to preserve and display these historical documents. They asked that we design something special. We wanted to add some color and prestige to the two letters. Pat started a search for the California Governor's Seal and the Presidential Seal. It was difficult to find a reproducible copy of the state seal, until Lucy contacted the State of California Library. They graciously e-mail several usable copies to us. The frame is a polished walnut with a gold lip. The navy blue mat, with red and gold edges, complements the colors of the seals. The letters were encapsulated in Mylar sleeves and the frame was completed with Conservation Clear glass.

Thanks, Donna and Bob. It is so inspiring to be able to "touch history".

The GIFT of a PURSE





Lucy designed the framing with an embossed suede backing that replicated the tooled pattern of leaves on the purse. The chestnut burl frame matched the aged leather perfectly. All the items were safely mounted over the suede background and the frame was completed with Museum (UV Filtering and Anti-Reflective) Glass.

Ornament from an Italian door

Sybil Roos found this charming copper and verdigris replica of a door ornament from the Cathedral in Verona. We chose a "ginger" color silk background to compliment the copper. We decided that a stacked frame would be perfect. Beginning on the inside we used a chemical-wash rustic peach lip. Next, we added a notched cap with both a green and rust wash. Finally the outer frame is a Florentina pattern that once again repeats the copper and green. This is a perfect combination to enhance a treasured souvenir.

Decoration from a Chinese Wedding

This beautiful and unusual embroidered and beaded ornament only needed some minor repair. Judy Baker found it in an antique shop in Shanghai, China. Lucy wanted the work to float over a background, so the ornament was attached to a sheet of Plexiglas[®] and lifted up. The top silk mat, Chablis, and the blue lip mat, Monaco, were wrapped over a custom cut scalloped pattern to follow the shape of the art. Judy and Lucy chose a handcarved, white gold frame to complete the design. The design on the frame replicated the feel of the pattern of the embroidery. The frames are now the same size and protected from fading with UV filtering Plexiglas®. When it is time to begin a new frame, we simply cut the mat for the current photo. The next year, we'll pick up the frame and add the new photo until it's full.
