Needlepoint Framing Wins Blue Ribbon

Congratulations to Janet Crass, winner of a Blue Ribbon at the American Needlework Guild Seminar in Albuquerque. Janet chose Bradley's to frame her exquisitely stitched



needlepoint "Spirit of the Southwest." The framing, design, and construction counts as 30% of the total scoring by the judges. We chose a taupe silk for the mat and a 12K white gold custom frame. The mat shape was plotted on the computer to exactly match the edge of the stitching. We covered a thick board with the silk to create a crisp deep bevel. The needlepoint was laced over rag board and cotton batting.

Three Wisemen Needlepoint
It seems to be the time of year to show this exquisitely stitched needlepoint of Three Wisemen by Marion Gerhart. The challenge for Ruth was to wrap and stretch the "Mat Arches" that were stitched separately from the figures. The beautiful condition of the needlework is preserved. We selected a 23K gold leaf frame and added one-inch depth to the frame to allow for all the layers. Thanks, Marion, we appreciate the opportunity.

Crochet Dress

Mrs. Joydell Kirtley brought us this beautifully preserved hand-made crochet dress, cap, and a photo of her wearing the dress. When the photo was taken, the dress and cap were tinted blue, probably to match her eyes. We thought this would look so much nicer if the color of the photo was correct. Since we were copying the photo and re-printing it in a smaller size, Bill digitally changed the dress color to emerald green. The frame is a gold shadow box with a delicate chain pattern. The photo is surrounded with a matching gold fillet and lifted up from the background of soft cream linen. The dress and cap, of course, were hand-stitched in place. It is our pleasure to add these special touches to your treasured mementos. Thanks, Mrs. Kirtley.



Metro National Banner

Shortly after September 11, 2001, a huge red, white, and blue banner, God Bless America, appeared on the top floor of Metro National's tallest building across from Memorial City. The banner was 20' by 240' and weighed over 300 lbs. It flew on the building for months until the weather took its toll. Linda Silver, of Metro National, brought in remnants of the banner and a photograph of the building. We selected a 30" by 18" fragment and floated the photograph over the surface. Steve lined the inside edges of the frame with banner pieces that that matched the background. We chose a mahogany cap with gold bead lip and UV filtering glass. This frame was presented to Metro National on September 11, 2002.



1980 Olympic Medals
Tom Tellez, former coach of the UH Track Team, brought us this set of very special Olympic Medals. In 1980, President Carter ordered a U.S. boycott of the Summer Olympics in Russia. Later these special gold medals were minted and presented to all the athletes and coaches who would have participated. Steve embossed the Olympic rings into a "Navy" silk background, placing the two medals into the two bottom rings. The ribbons were pulled up to the top edge of the frame. A gold "cap" frame and glass spacer completed the design. Tom, thanks for letting us help preserve a moment in history. 
Antique Fishing Lures

The lures are "floating" on hidden dowells giving a real dimensional effect inside the walnut stained oak shadow box. Thanks, Rose for another great idea.

We found some numbered and alphabetized map tacks and used them with the computergenerated legend to identify all the pieces. We built a distressed pine shadow box and matted with a "Truffle" silk top mat, accented with a rust red background. What a great way to combine a fun vacation with some learning skills. 


Congratulations
